



RESOLUTION
RECOGNIZING IUGO
CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Eight

RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen recognize IUGO's accomplishments as they approach their first year anniversary.

IUGO, which is Greater Nashua's premier organization for young professionals, was created by the Greater Nashua Chamber of Commerce in June 2007. IUGO was created with the specific mission of serving as the gateway to success for young professionals seeking to develop their social and professional networks through community engagement within the Greater Nashua region.

IUGO has three specific goals:

- Create and develop events and activities designed to promote both social and professional connections and development among young professionals
- Promote Greater Nashua community as a place to live, work and play for young professionals
- Provide a strong community voice for young professionals in the region

Since its creation in 2007, IUGO has quickly established itself as a state and national leader on issues important to young professionals. In September 2007, IUGO was invited to address an audience of 700 young professionals at the National YP Summit in Louisville, Kentucky. In February 2008, IUGO was asked by Governor John Lynch to serve as the co-chairman of his newly created Task Force for the Retention and Recruitment of a Young Workforce in New Hampshire.

IUGO is the fastest growing member-based organization within southern New Hampshire having grown from 17 founding members in June 2007 to over 800 in June 2008.

IUGO continues to generate cutting-edge programming aimed at improving the lives of young professionals and improving our community, through bi-monthly professional development seminars and better living events. IUGO will introduce new programs in the summer of 2009 to celebrate its 1-year anniversary which is occurring in June 2008.
